

or over 150 years, our School, founded in 1872 in Guangzhou, and established in Hong Kong in 1935, has provided an excellent and holistic Christian education where students are given an optimal environment and encouraged to strive for their best.

Over the years, True Light has nurtured countless outstanding alumni who shine in different places around the world, serving the community and contributing to the betterment of the country.

Today, The True Light School of Hong Kong is a vibrant community of 2,000 students, comprising of a kindergarten, a primary and a secondary section.

Our Mission

True Light places preeminent emphasis on fostering students' moral character and is committed to upholding the school motto "You

are the Light of the World". As a school with a long history, True Light not only preserves its excellent traditions but also keeps pace with the times and is courageous in innovating and reforming. The School is committed to providing the best education where our students embrace the school principles of building and creating, loving and serving the community, exhibiting self-discipline and sacrifice, and striving for excellence.

The Challenge

Having housed the kindergarten and primary school since 1955, we now have a building that has seen 70 years of service and is confronted with significant and costly maintenance. Moreover, the campus complex layout and its facilities have failed to meet the evolving needs of our students. Compounded by the issue of inadequate classroom space, the auditorium,

sports ground, and gymnasium are stretched beyond capacity, and shared amongst the student body from all three sections. These critical issues underscore the urgent need for a comprehensive redevelopment to uphold and advance our educational mission.

Building for the Future

In response to current challenges, the School Board unanimously approved the 'True Light Centenary Redevelopment Project' and launched the project at the 89th Anniversary Thanksgiving Service. Our vision is to breathe new life into our campus by demolishing the aging structures and constructing a state-of-the-art 8-story building. This new edifice will not only house sufficient and strategically organized classrooms but also foster connections between people and spaces. Features like the grand staircase will encourage interactions, while barrier-free access ensures that our school is welcoming to all.

The new building is designed with the future in mind, supporting a multitude of disciplines. It will be a hub where students can acquire digital knowledge, foster cognitive development, hone social skills, and appreciate music and art, nurturing global awareness. Beyond academics, the space will be a crucible for developing leadership, curiosity, creativity, well-being, motivation, and collaboration.

We fully understand that the success of the Redevelopment Project hinges on extensive support and contributions. As we approach the centennial of True Light's foundation in Hong



Kong, we extend our deepest gratitude to our heavenly Father for guiding us on the journey of the redevelopment project. Speech Day

Address by Guest of Honour

Professor Yuen Kowk Yung



Principal HUI, honourable teachers, distinguished guests, parents, students, ladies and gentlemen,

Many thanks for inviting me to your Speech Day at the True Light Middle School of Hong Kong. Let me first offer my very sincere congratulations to the graduating Class of 2024, and to the proud parents as well as teachers. This is one of the most memorable days for yourself and your family, and I wish you all the very best for the future. Being a Form Seven graduate of 1976, I am particularly grateful that you have given me this great opportunity to recollect many memorable experiences during my secondary school days, and how much my secondary school education changed my life and equipped me to become a doctor, a scientist and a teacher.

Life in Hong Kong was quite difficult in the 1960s to 1970s. My family was living in a subdivided flat of about 60 square feet with an attic in Sai Ying Pun. I slept in the attic with my parents and three other brothers. My father worked below this subdivided flat as a dental technician making dentures 16 hours a day. Our family shared a kitchen which had running tap water and kerosene or coal stoves with four other families. The hygiene was very poor as there were no toilet facilities. We simply uringted into the floor drain of the kitchen and collected our night soil in a pan. The pan was emptied into a common sewage barrel for collection by the government's mobile sewage tank at midnight. I can still remember that a 30-year-old lady in one of the families died after three days of fever, and one of my classmates in Primary



Two died of fever one week after absence from class. Life was very fragile in those days!

I was fortunate to have a very caring mother who kept her children fed and safe from fatal infections. Though parts of my lungs were damaged by bronchiectasis and tuberculosis, I did not have much disability except for some occasional cough with blood streaks. Poverty was not just associated with the filthiness of littering and spitting, malnutrition and sickness, but also with foul language, superstitions and idol worship, gambling, heroin addiction, and physical violence. My mother was not formally educated but very strict. When I came 15th out of 40 in the half-yearly examination in Primary One, she hit my palm 14 times with a wooden ruler. When I came second in the final examination of Primary One, she still hit my palm one time. Her unorthodox perseverance on my school performance paid off when my marks at the secondary school entrance examination qualified me to study at Queen's College in 1969.

The Form One year was a really painful experience because I could not comprehend the speech of the British Principal and many teachers speaking in English. While in despair, it was by serendipity that I bumped into a 3 year more senior alumnus at the roof top

of the Astronomers' Club on a Friday evening. He reassured me that there was nothing to fear, and advised me to read up everything step by step. Besides teaching me the basics of astronomy, he gave me my first taste of auditory bliss in the form of Dvořák's New World symphony and Tchaikovsky's first piano concerto, performed by the Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra at the City Hall. This eye-opening concert experience amidst tranquility, cleanliness and punctuality enlightened me to pursue another way of living. My English slowly improved with more practice after overcoming my shyness through participating in English dramas and singing English songs at QC.

Knowing how to borrow books from libraries of the City Hall and school library, I learnt about the unassuming attitude and meticulousness of Sherlock Holmes, the limitless space adventures of Star Trek, the complicated internal struggles of Hamlet, and the intense emotions of Romeo and Juliet. At the roof top of my secondary school, I learnt from my seniors about black holes, quasars, neutron stars, red shift and the expanding universe. They also showed me how to read the star atlas, use steel grit to grind the concave mirror, plate silver on the mirror to make a Newtonian reflector telescope and then measure the focal length. Others taught me how to use the telescope to take photos of moon eclipse, count sunspots, and develop photographic films in the dark room. These experiences aroused my interest to study physics and chemistry.

There are classmates who are excellent organiser, led us in making visits to the huge observatory and telescope of our Assistant Principal, and taught us how to take care of the daily needs of almost 100

people joining the astronomical observation camp in the Yuen Long Plain. Through these enjoyable experiences, I started to know about team spirit and leadership. Another classmate encouraged me to think about the importance of moral values as exemplified by the ultimate reality of truth and love in the biblical context. He told me that any change for the better starts with acknowledging our shortcomings (that is called confession) and followed by targeted actions (that is called repentance).

I am sure that you would agree with me that our school environment, classmates and our very caring teachers have been influential in shaping our education. Moreover, extra-curricular activities would arouse our interest to overcome the mundaneness of our studies, but might not directly help us in passing examinations. Our seniors always tell us not to depend on others but have to find our own way out through diligence and adaptability. Others can only give you hints and some short-term guidance. Besides reading books, we dissected rats, dog fish, earthworms and cockroaches on the roof top together, drew and labeled the internal organs, and tried to learn the skills from each other after school. Our caring teachers often sympathised with our examination pressure. I was late one morning before the university entrance examination, and should normally have received some punishment, but the teacher just gave me a pat on the shoulder and told me to have more rest.

This was how I graduated from my secondary school and entered the medical school of HKU, but what I learnt most from my school days is the importance of truth and love in building our core values. By

upholding fairness, compassion, humility and pursuit of excellence, QC boys are able to convert our differences of opinion, ability and values, through peaceful and openminded interactions, into new insights, innovations and strength that sustain us through life's challenges.

Looking back at the age of 67, my childhood poverty and personal sickness have bestowed me with empathy to care for the poor and needy as a medical doctor. My secondary school education has provided me the environment to acquire the core values, knowledge, logic, skills and passion to become a scientist and teacher at HKU. As an infectious disease microbiologist, finding new pathogenic viruses or bacteria amidst trillions of other microbes is like finding a star amidst trillions of other celestial objects.

The standards of living and education in Hong Kong and Mainland China have markedly improved in the last 40 years. Information is overwhelming in the Internet while geopolitical and socio-economic situations are changing rapidly within a day. Every field or sector is full of cut-throat competition. Our survival depends on rapid adaptation to changes by innovation such as Artificial Intelligence and the threat from global competition. But only truth and love will set us free from these suffocating worries and chaos, because "in repentance and rest you will be saved, in quietness and trust is your strength".

Let us always remember that "Curiosity breeds innovation; logic sets pathways; perseverance brings fruition; but only love endures." Thank you again for inviting me to join your Speech Day, and I wish all of you the very best in your future endeavours.



Together, WE Grow Up with JOY

Good afternoon, Professor Yuen, **Board of Trustees, Distinguished** Guests, Principal, Teachers, Parents and Students. As we're all aware, 'Inside Out 2' has been a global sensation. While we're all eager to see it, I won't spoil it. However, a quote resonates deeply with me and, I believe, with us graduates: "I don't know how to stop anxiety. Maybe that's what happens when you grow up, you feel LESS JOY." Yes, indeed, growing up is a paradox—simple in its patterns, yet complex in the kaleidoscope of emotions we experience. Which character do you relate to more: Joy, Sadness or the newer emotions like Embarrassment, as Keung To so aptly described?

Good afternoon, I'm **Emily Au from S6A**. You might see me as Joy, but I fear failure. And I hate making mistakes, as if they define my worth.

My math is a prime example— I could score as low as 30 on an exam. I would tell myself, "I'm just not a math person, and NEVER am I good at it." This fixed mindset held me back from improving. In fact, I repeated my S1 studies. Before that, I was so worried about the stigma of being held back. "Will I fit in? Will I fail again?" However, after that extra year, I understood that letting go of fear and stigma isn't about denying our imperfections. It's about accepting that mistakes, setbacks and disappointments are a part of life. It's about changing how we view failure, not as a measure of our worth, but as chances to learn and grow.

I may not excel in math; I have other strengths. Why should I



fear my limitations? Or do these limitations equal failures? In 'Inside Out,' Sadness warns Joy, "You'll get lost," to which Joy replies, "Think positive!" And Sadness concludes, "Okay. I'm positive that you'll get lost!" It's right to stay positive. But what I want to say is: "You're right, Sadness. I know my instinct is to focus on the positive, but I'm learning I'm imperfect. Still, I'm ready to let go of my rigid idea of what happiness should look like and feel whatever comes up. That's all part of growing up, isn't it?"

Growing up is bittersweet. As we mature, we trade our childlike behaviors for new duties, fearing that our "true self" might get lost. Yet we have the power to hold onto something precious.

Good afternoon, I'm Joanne Hung from S6C, a modern-day Bing Bong. Last December, when I stepped into the Variety Show, you might have thought, "An S6 student?" But it was our chance to unearth those hidden talents, skills and passions we've buried under the weight of adolescence. We were like Bing Bong, cheering, "Hooray!" as we showed you our true colors.

Sakura, you were all about spreading joy, weren't you? Cynosure, you aimed to craft

memories that would stick with our class forever, right? And Hayley, you were there to showcase your talents, doing what you love and do best, am I wrong? Even with stage fright, we all dared to try. In that moment, our inner Bing Bongs were glowing brighter than ever. "Who's your friend who likes to play? Who's the best in every way, and wants to sing this song to say, Bing Bong, Bing Bong!"

She replied, "Tell me about it." This casual chat was the start of expanding my circle. Soon after, Hailey, Jin, and Charmaine became my friends, as during a PE lesson on Tai Chi, I saw the trio practising and asked, "Can you teach me?"

School Development Plan and Major Concerns

School Development Plan 2021/22 - 2023/24

> "Try all-IN, SET to Shine" are the main goals for the years 2021-24. The main focus is to propose the Six Character Traits in the cultivation of students:

Inquisitive, Initiative, Innovative

In the learning and teaching process, give students autonomy in exploration and opportunities to construct knowledge and get creative, cultivate students to become learners with an inquisitive mind, initiative and innovation.

SET: Synergy, Empathy, Tenacity

Encourage students to empathize with the needs of the community and collaborate side by side with their peers from idea, planning action to review and adjustment, which lets students experience experimentation, frustration and success in teamwork to build up their tenacious willpower.

major concern (1) Learning and Teaching

This is the third year of the implementation of the Development Plan. Strategies from three perspectives are adopted for the whole school:

- in lessons to cultivate students to become learners with an inquisitive mind, initiative and innovation
 - 1.1 Subject panels conduct learning activities in classroom learning and teaching process for each level which is focused on at least one of the five elements of learning (teamwork, communication and creation, personalization of learning, critical thinking and real-world engagement).
 - 1.2 Subject panels review their assessment policy and explore the variation of assessment methods such as non-drilling exercises, etc. In addition, integrate more innovative elements in daily assignments.
 - 1.3 The Academic Affairs Section coordinates S1, S2 Science and S3 Life and Society to conduct a project-based assignment through scientific investigation approach and enquiry approach respectively.

- 1. Teachers provide learning opportunities 2. To equip students to develop good learning habits in order to become learners with an inquisitive mind, initiative and innovation
 - 2.1 Life-wide Learning Day is held to provide learning opportunities for S1 and S2 students to experience real-world engagement in learning by PSHE and Science KLAs respectively.
 - 2.2 OLE presentation is conducted for selected projects and learning activities.
 - 2.3 The Reading Promotion Team and the School Library set the theme of the year as "Reading and Travelling — A Journey of Discovery". Various activities will be held to align with the theme and major concerns of 2021-2024 to raise students' awareness and
 - 2.4 Through reading across the curriculum activities, the School Library collaborates with subject panels to foster an environment in which students are encouraged to pursue knowledge on their own.

- To enhance teachers' competences to provide learning opportunities in lessons to cultivate students to become learners with an inquisitive mind, initiative and innovation
 - 3.1 To create stronger and better professional practice together through lesson study in subject panels, 2-3 subject teachers in the same/different forms in the Panel are assigned into groups by the Panel Head. Each group of subject teachers fills in
- the Lesson Study Form for reflection and keeps the teaching materials on Google Shared Drive/Panels Server for sharing and archiving.
- 3.2 To hold sharing sessions to enhance teachers' competences to provide effective teaching.
- 3.3 To extend the horizons of teachers by organizing out-of-school visits to educational/educational-related institutions.

English Language Education "See the World Education Programme"

With the mentality of bringing students to see the world, the English curriculum is to extend their learning from inside the classroom to outside the classroom. This year, the programme has connected with *other departments* so as to create more world-wide real-life situations for students to learn and use English.

CONNECT with the Careers and Guidance Team

Locally, we have connected to *Inspiring Girls Hong Kong* to provide career introductions, company visits and mentorship programmes for S4 and S5 students. Nationally, two S4 students will set off to a **2-day, 1-night GBA (Great Bay Area) Study Tour** run by the *Law Society of Hong Kong—Teen Talk, and Sing Tao Daily.* Globally, seventeen S2 to S5 students are heading to *Holland for a 14-day Sustainable Entrepreneur Camp* in July-August.

CONNECT with the Library

Regular English good work displays started this year. "Travelogue" (S2) and "Biography" (S4), and the KLA compendium — "Hidden Gems" (LAC Team) were displayed in the second term.

SPEAK UP to CHALLENGE Yourself — Intra-class Debating Activity for S3

To create an authentic platform for students to experiment with speech writing in a real situation, each English group of students tried out a debating activity according to their level of English in the second term.

Mathematics Education

The Mathematics Panel's major concern focused on fostering students' authentic learning. This year, to address this, students in each level were provided with chapter summary worksheets or booklets at least once per term. They were required to complete these worksheets by using tables, mind maps, or other means to display their learning process. Through these worksheets, the students showed how they consolidated their own knowledge and where they had any misconceptions that the teachers then helped to clarify. Students also shared examples they understood well and the learning difficulties they faced in the summary sheets. This exercise not only gave students opportunities to improve their learning practices, but also provided teachers with valuable insights to adjust their learning and teaching strategies in the lessons accordingly.

Student Support & School Ethos

Providing more opportunities for students to think, explore and try is our main direction. Highlights of the strategies and programmes adopted by departments and forms are as follows:

Cultural & Religious Exchange Tour: Taiwan

22 students were selected to participate in the tour to exchange spiritual experiences and the love of God with churches, young people and indigenous people in Taiwan. They also


volunteered in a Christian center which serves marginalized people in Kaohsiung. Training and sharing sessions were conducted beforehand and afterwards.

> Career Exploration

Early Engagement in Life Planning Education (LPE):

Throughout the academic year, S1 students took part in a single Day IV Homeroom Session, while S2 students had the opportunity to engage in two sessions. These sessions aimed to help students discover their unique talents, interests, and passions, providing a platform to

explore a broad spectrum of careers, including emerging ones. Moreover, our Student Careers Team designed creative lunchtime activities for \$1\$ students to reinforce workshop concepts and objectives.

Career Exploration for S3-6 Students:

For S3-5 students, a series of Careers Exploration Certificate Courses were provided, each consisting of 10 hours of instructions covering topics such as *sign language and professional makeup*. Ongoing initiatives, like many programmes co-worked with NGOs helped students to explore their interests, talents, and potential career paths. Additionally, activities like human libraries, alumni sharing sessions, career talks, and company visits were regularly organized, including during the S5 Life-wide Learning Day, to offer practical insights for senior form students to make important life decisions.

2.2 Provide more chances for students to be aware of, empathize with the needs of others and collaborate with their peers to respond to the needs with new ideas and actions.

Highlights of Form Activities:

- S1: My Dream Classroom

- The project implementation plans submitted by all four classes showed that students were able to give a fair review of the operation of the class committees; and the plans they proposed truly addressed the needs or wishes of their class, namely better classroom environment, resources (snacks and stationery) for sharing, and better peer support (study and emotional needs).
- With the help of the implementation plan template, all the four classes were able to produce workable plans, clearly listing the tasks, resources needed, persons-in-charge

and work schedule. Several classes also formulated and fine-tuned the rules and implementation of their class projects (e.g. playing music during lunchtime and snack corner) through on-going trial and error.

- S2: Serve our Neighbors

- Class teachers have collected the students' opinions through questionnaires to understand what kind of services they would like to commit to.
- Most students were willing to get involved in the services, such as TL Round Trip receptionists and student helpers of the Christmas Show of Hong Kong True Light Kindergarten—Caine Road.

- S5: Lead by Serving, Cultivate by Learning

Three sessions (4 hours in total) of activities such as games and sharing focusing on the topic of **"Servant Leadership"** had been conducted.

- 72% students agreed that these sessions had given them the opportunity to reinforce their understanding of the 24 character strengths, deepening their self-awareness regarding their own character strengths.
- S6: Embrace Challenges; Together, We Strive and Stride
 - IG online platform

The Form Committee members had sent DSE-related messages and encouraging quotes regularly on Instagram. The actions of teachers and students let all S6 students get encouragement and achieve synergy effects.

To cultivate students to be punctual and self-disciplined, Masters of Timekeeping Challenge was held in two phases, dated 13th November-5th December, 2023 and 18th April-22nd May, 2024. Subjects involved in the competition included VA, Music, HE, ASD and PE. Students were required to attend these classes on time, and the competition aimed to enhance the concept of punctuality among all students and teachers.



Inclusive Education Section

Support for Students with Special Educational Needs

To further cultivate an inclusive school culture and enhance the effectiveness of the support given to students with special educational needs, the Student Support Team has been formed to develop and implement integrated education through a whole school approach. The following are some of this year's highlights:

a. Different Activities in Art Therapy

Students learnt how to respect others and improve their social skills. They also learnt how to express their emotions through art. Through different categories of artistic activities such as dancing and drawing, students' self-confidence, expression and communication skills have been boosted.

b. Healing Hugs Therapy Dogs

Students learnt to express themselves effectively, manage their emotions, and communicate with other group members through interactions with animals. The participating students were highly engaged and enjoyed the activities, while the instructors were able to guide them in discovering themselves within the group.

c. Career exploration

Career exploration activities helped students understand different job characteristics and experience various aspects of work, thereby broadening their horizons and equipping them with more possibilities for their future career choices.







In alignment with the theme "Try all-IN – SET to Shine", the Careers Guidance Team is dedicated to empowering students through independent exploration of diverse study and career paths, skill development, and navigation of the professional world.

Empowering Early Engagement and Career Exploration

The Team actively engaged S1 and S2 students in Life Planning Education (LPE) by forming partnerships with CAPALA Limited and the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups. Through Day IV Homeroom Sessions, students explored their unique talents, interests, and potential career paths. For S3 to S6 students, ongoing initiatives such as the IMPROVEd project and the Business-School

Partnership Programme (BSPP) were enhanced by a series of Careers Exploration Certificate Courses, workshops, and talks integrated into the English curriculum. These initiatives featured activities like human libraries, alumni sharing sessions, and company visits, all aimed at offering practical insights into various career options.



Fostering Authentic Experiences and Goal Setting

To promote authentic experiences and inclusivity, the Team collaborated with organizations such as Inspiring Girls Hong Kong, along with alumni and parents, to arrange job shadowing opportunities for S4 and S5 students. This initiative enabled students to gain firsthand experience in various professions. Additionally, partnerships with the Equal Opportunities Commission and NCS alumni led to the establishment of a mentorship programme specifically for Non-Chinese Students (NCSs), offering tailored guidance and support. Structured activities during Day IV Homeroom Sessions were designed to help students identify their strengths and set career goals, with each form focusing on specific developmental areas:



S1-2: Discovering Me, Exploring Careers
S3: Mapping Paths, Choosing Subjects
S4: Connecting Passions, Building Careers
S5: Exploring Studies, Shaping Futures
S6: Deciding Subjects, Charting Success

Standout Highlights of the Year

i) Summer 2023 Media Experience

In the summer of 2023, four S5-S6 students-Au Man Hei, Huang Zhixin, Leung Wing Yin (all from S6A), and You Sze Wun (from S5D) participated in the《傳媒初體驗》organized by RTHK. This dynamic programme included seminars, workshops, and job shadowing experiences focused on radio production and documentary filmmaking. The students collaborated to produce a 3-5-minute infotainment programme that beautifully showcased the diverse cultures of Hong Kong. Their dedication culminated in an awards ceremony on March 7, 2024, where they were honored as First Runner-up. Their work was also broadcast on RTHK, providing them with significant recognition and a platform to share their achievements with a wider audience.





ii) Career Exploration Certificate Course

Twelve S1-S5 students participated in a 10-hour Sign Language Certificate Course offered by The Hong Kong Society for the Deaf. Participants thrived in the interactive learning atmosphere, with one student reflecting, "As a beginner, everything about this field is new to me. An important lesson I've learned is that we'll never know every single sign. It's essential to be brave enough to express ourselves in our own way." Through engaging activities, students not only enhanced their communication skills but also sparked their creativity, with many expressing a strong desire to continue their sign language education.

iii) HKGCC Business School Partnership Programme

In May 2024, the Student Careers Team attended an inspiring career talk hosted by Karrie International Holdings Limited, part of the HKGCC Business School Partnership Programme 2023/24. The talk emphasized the company's commitment to employee well-being and innovation. Students left feeling motivated, with one noting, "We strive to be agents of positive change, dedicated to the well-being of our peers and the advancement of our fields." This reflection captures their desire to incorporate these values into their future careers. Additionally, S4C Lee Nap Yi and S4D Kong Hiu Ching received the Outstanding Students' Reports Award for their exemplary work.

iv) Sustainable Entrepreneur Camp



The programme enhances students' concepts about the rule of law, justice and civic responsibility and critical thinking, so as to strengthen their moral judgement and their awareness of crime prevention.



- collaboration with HKU Faculty of Science: To enhance students' understanding of carbon footprints and sustainable development, our S3 students joined an educational workshop on our campus. 
Evangelical Fortnight 2024: Welcome Home!



Extra-Curricular Activity Team

Aims and Objectives of ECA Team

To foster whole-person development, the ECA Team aims at organising activities that promote moral, intellectual, physical, social, aesthetic and spiritual education to nurture students' multiple intelligences and emotional intelligence. All ECA groups are targeted to:

- 1. Cultivate students' morality and citizenship through learning better time management;
- Develop students' sense of belonging through working collaboratively with teachers;
- Strengthen students' interpersonal skills through being a team-player and a leader; and
- 4. Expose students to an array of experiences through participating in various kinds of experiential learning activities.

Highlights of the year:

1. Leadership Training

The Leadership Training Programmes were organized from October to November. Stage 1 offers a Leadership Training Day Camp, fostering self-awareness and interpersonal skills. Stage 2 is a compulsory practicum where students plan activities for all students. These programmes aim to enhance leadership skills and personal growth, empowering students to take ownership of their lives. By providing hands-on experiences and opportunities for collaboration, these programmes will equip S4 students with the necessary skills to become effective leaders.



2. Community Engagement

a) 'Love Overflows'

The aim of 'Love Overflows' is to enable students to actively connect with and understand the needs of different social groups in the community. This fosters empathy and a sense of social responsibility, inspiring students to contribute meaningfully to the betterment of their community. Through 'Love Overflows',

students also develop important leadership and communication skills as they plan and lead initiatives that address the needs of these social groups. This hands-on experience empowers students to become active agents of positive change within their communities.

Students in S4 and S5 were assigned to serve different target groups for different services:

i. Children from low-income families

ii. South Asian children

iii. The elderly

iv. The animals

b) Life-wide Learning Day

The activity aims to provide participants an opportunity to achieve the aims of whole-person development and enable them to develop the lifelong learning capabilities needed in our ever-changing society. It also aims to raise awareness about these groups and the underlying causes of social problems, and inspire participants to take action and contribute to positive change. The participants can choose between the Animal Shelter visit and the Scavenger experience. The participants' firsthand experiences can foster understanding of the social needs.

In the coming year, we look forward to continuing the enlightenment of our members' scientific minds and sharing the joy of science with them.




History Society

Art Society



At the start of the school year, our committee members were very fortunate to have been granted the opportunity to create a few installation artworks for the Tai Hang neighborhood. During this process, we gained deeper insights into the community that surrounds us. We were very proud to be part of an art initiative aimed at promoting the Hakka cultural heritage of Tai Hang to the general public, thereby preserving a valuable piece of our cultural legacy.

From November to February, our members dedicated themselves to the intricate craft of stamp carving. Utilizing their carving skills, our members personalized stamps bearing their own Chinese names. Both the design and carving processes demanded meticulous effort, offering our members the chance to hone their concentration and patience. To put these custom stamps to use, we crafted Chinese New Year decorations through calligraphic writing, finally stamping our names upon these festive creations.

On 21st December, our members participated in M+ museum's 'Social engagement experiments of Chinese contemporary artists workshop', wherein our members explored the mindsets of modern Chinese artists and contemplated the artwork's connections with various societal issues.

From April to May, we engaged in the crafting of three-dimensional sculptures using molding plaster. Our members exercised their creativity and collaboratively constructed these threedimensional artworks in small groups. They brainstormed themes ranging from flowers and vases to marine species and sustainable development. Through this activity, we experimented with new materials and acquired molding skills.

In the years ahead, the Art Society will remain committed to cultivating the artistic talents of our members, in addition to nurturing their ability to observe through the lens of an artist.

STEAM Team

In 2023-2024, a compilation highlighting a spectrum of STEAM activities was conducted throughout the year. Delve into the intersection of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics initiatives that have inspired students' creativity and critical thinking. The school aims to provide step-by-step exposure to every student, hence we have "STEAM for ALL", especially for S1-2 students.

STEAM for ALL

Our commitment to STEAM for ALL ensures that every student has the opportunity to explore and excel in these interdisciplinary fields, preparing them for a future where diverse skill sets are paramount.

To promote STEAM for ALL, the school is trying to offer a comprehensive STEAM experience that is inclusive and accessible to all students. Aiming to foster logical thinking and problem-solving skills in every individual, the school has organized various workshops and activities throughout the year.

Starting with S1 students, during their Pre-S1 Get-Set-Go Program in 2023 Aug, they were given a taste and participated in STEAM activities including Lego Spike Prime, XR, and Robotics. This ignites their interest in STEAM and encourages their further development.

There are a total of over 88 students who participated in the courses and workshops on different topics, including Unity, Roblox, VR TL Campus, and courses that are specifically for S1 students as a follow-up of the pre-S1 program. Over 40 % of the S1 students participated in the courses and they have learned that is important to learn from mistakes and modify their projects in a better way.

In Mar 2024, we organized a Code Combat Fun Day for the S2 students as a Python Coding Explorer Program during the Life-Wide Learning Day. The students are excited and found learning coding is not as hard and boring as they thought. They are engaged in the program and it cultivates their logical thinking skills and communication skills as they work in groups to compete against each other.

During the post-exam period, in June-Jul 2024, the school organized experiential workshops for Secondary 1 students. A "Vacuum Cleaner Workshop" and a "Micro: bit Rocket Car Workshop" for the S1 students.

They have practical hands-on experience and chances to do experiential learning via STEAM activities. They demonstrated excellent design thinking skills and applied scientific knowledge to improve their designs. At the end, they have gained a greater comprehension of scientific concepts through hands-on and mind-on exercises.





STEAM for Elite

Our school focuses on providing advanced and tailored opportunities for high-achieving students in STEAM. Through specialized programs, enriched challenges, and mentorship, we aim to cultivate the talents and passions of our elite students, nurturing their potential to excel in these critical fields and become leaders in innovation and discovery.

The STEAM Team of the 2023-24 academic year consisted of 40 students, with 16 from junior levels and 24 from senior levels. Students participated in different competitions and workshops.

Competitions

In the Nov 2023, 3 Form 4 students participated in the **IdeaGO Ideathon Competition** which requires students to formulate solutions and prototypes to address health and well-being challenges faced by women in society. They won "The 1st Runner Up" and "The Most Popular Award".

The highlight of the year came in Jul 2024, when our students won several competitions including the "Student Mentorship Program on Innovation and Technology 2023/24" and the "FIRST LEGO League 2023–2024".

In the "Mentorship Program", a group of 4 S3 students entered the final 5 among over a hundred groups that have submitted their ideas. In the final round, they won the Pitch Competition among all the Junior Secondary Schools.



For the FIRST LEGO League 2023-2024, they won the Overall 2nd Runner-up in the competition and the 2nd Runner-up position in robot design. Following the success of the competition, the students were selected to represent Hong Kong at the 2024 FIRST LEGO League Asia Open Championship. At the Championship, apart from robot games and presentations, our students also had the opportunity to set up a booth to exchange

ideas with participants from other countries. We were delighted to learn that our school's team had been awarded 3rd Place, a remarkable achievement considering the level of the competition, Asia-Open.



S4 Mechanical Flower



In the Spring semester, embarking on a journey of creativity and innovation, a group of students with relevant electives were given a chance to participate in the Mechanical Flower workshop. The school aimed to ignite curiosity and provide additional exposure to the students for a future where diverse skill sets are paramount. Besides letting them engage in hands-on learning, this workshop aims to cultivate design skills, engineering knowledge, and teamwork, offering students a unique advantage in exploring the different realms of STEAM education.



Overall, the STEAM Team had a successful year, showcasing our dedication to STEAM education and innovation through active participation in workshops, activities, services, and competitions for all students and elite students.

Maths Team


In order to develop the potential of brighter students, the Math Team selected top students from each form in September and provided courses to those students in the first term to enhance their confidence and widen their horizons in Mathematics. There are totally 21 members in our team.

This was the eighteenth year for the Math Team to hold the True Light Girls' Invitational Mathematics Contest. Forty-nine secondary schools participated in the contest held on 25th November, 2023. Good responses were received from the participating schools.

By providing students with chances to participate in various competitions, including Question of the Month, students' problem-solving ability, creativity and high-order thinking ability were enhanced.

Besides, the Math Team members were invited to participate in 13 inter-school Mathematics competitions, including The International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) (for S1 to S3), PolyU SCIENCE Young Talents Competition (for S4 to S5), Mathematics Book Report Competition for Secondary Schools 2023/2024 (for S1 to S3), Creative Infographic Design Competition on Applications of Mathematics for Primary and Secondary Schools (2023/24) (for S1 to S5), Hua Luo-geng Cup Mathematics Competition (for S1 to S2), Hong Kong Mathematical High Achievers Selection Contest (for S3), IMO (for S5), Math Conceptition (for S1 to S4), Eye Level Math Olympiad (for S2 to S3), TIMO (for S3 to S4), Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area Mathematical Olympiad (for S2 to S5), HKIMO (for S2 to S4) and HKMO (for S5 or below). Students got excellent results in various competitions, including 2 distinctions, 12 credits, 9 merits, 1 honourable mention certificate, 1 Certificate of Excellence, 3 gold awards, 7 silver awards, 10 bronze awards, 1 second honor award, 3 second honor awards and 9 third honor awards.

Fostering Connections: Highlights of TLMSHK Guangzhou Sister School Exchange Tour




Day 2: SUP and Raft Building

We shared our different cultures with each other and even played card games together!




S4C Fiona Cheng

From 28th July to 1st August, 2024, S4C student Wan Choi Ting Emily represented Hong Kong at the Asian and Oceanian High School Students' Forum held in Wakayama, Japan. The forum aims to develop the ability of high school students in the Asia-Pacific region to see issues from a global perspective by exchanging opinions with peers from various Asian and Oceanian countries/areas on global challenges such as natural hazards, poverty, and diversity. Additionally, through opportunities to convey their ideas to others, the forum seeks to foster leaders who can play active roles in international society.

Here is the reflection by Emily Wan.

Aiming to nurture future leaders and enhance the global perspective of high school students, the Asian and Oceanian High School Students' Forum is an international event organized by the Wakayama Prefecture Government. This forum includes students from various countries in the Asia-Pacific region, including Indonesia, Thailand, South Korea, Australia, Vietnam, Turkey, and more. By discussing pressing global issues such as poverty, diversity, and measures against tsunamis and disasters, participants can learn about different cultures and broaden their perspectives. Hoping to enhance my public speaking skills and deepen my understanding of various cultures, I decided to participate in this forum. It was indeed a rewarding and valuable experience that expanded my horizons.

During the Opening Ceremony, I had the great honour of presenting my research on the challenges faced by non-Chinese speaking (NCS) students in Hong Kong as a demonstration in front of the Governor of Wakayama Prefecture, the President of the Wakayama International Exchange Association, local TV crew members, and fellow student participants from Japan and other countries. The following day, I attended the Sectional Meeting, where I listened to other students present their research. As a participant in the diversity category, I learned about various aspects of diversity issues worldwide. For instance, the representative from Korea shared his research on political diversity and the performance of leaders, while the representative from Vietnam presented her views on the unfair treatment and discrimination that athletes face in sports events. Other diversity issues explored included the concept of alternative families, promoting diversity in the workplace, and addressing gender stereotypes in Japan.

Our work did not end with the Sectional Meeting. In the evening, we convened to summarize the key findings from our individual research and prepare a group presentation for the upcoming General Meeting, where we would lead a discussion on the most pressing diversity issues and produce a concluding statement. By listening to diverse research on these issues and collaborating

with different participants, I gained a better understanding of diversity and inclusion around the world and improved my teamwork skills.

Another memorable occasion was the Welcome Reception hosted by the Governor of Wakayama Prefecture. At the reception, participants from various countries wore traditional ethnic costumes and performed traditional dances and songs. It was truly enjoyable to watch these performances and engage in conversations with participants from other research categories. After much friendly chitchat and endless group selfies, I made friends with participants from different parts of Japan and other Asia-Pacific countries, which helped me become better acquainted with various cultures.

The UNESCO World Heritage also features seas of cherry blossoms, attracting visitors from all over the world during blooming seasons such as spring and fall to admire the colorful pink tree tops with their magnificent shades or the warm fall foliage with its falling beige leaves. On the way out, I passed the Sekka-tei (tea house) and the Fudo-do Temple, which is an active Buddhist temple wth incense burning outside. The Zen atmosphere surrounded me as the worshippers rang the bells and banged the drums to awaken the Buddha gods so they could hear their prayers. Behind the temple is a small Shinto shrine that allows wish makers to hedge their bets.

Still amazed by the striking view, we got back onto the tour bus and started our miniature road trip to Kivomizu-dera, After a 30-minute scenic bus ride, we made it to Kiyomizu-dera, also called the Pure Water Temple due to the spring water you can taste from the Otowa Waterfall beneath it, which is said to have healing powers. From its famous wooden terrace, you can gaze down at the most amazing view of downtown Kyoto and the temple building next to it, which is most captivating at night. There are also three more facilities and events that are worth a watch. First and foremost, the temple is known for its charm-selling shop, which offers charms that protect buyers from a myriad of dangers such as car accidents, loss of safety of loved ones, and many more that the Japanese believe in. If you buy a charm, the temple offers visitors to write a prayer on the back and hang the charm on a wall of strings and signs. While I was looking at the many prayer cards hanging in the wind, I felt humbled by the cries from the hearts of the other visitors, their compassion for their family and friends, and their tender thanksgiving for the welcomes and opportunities they have received in Japan and from the charms as well. Second but not last, if you walk behind the main hall and the viewing stage, on the side of the hill, you will find the smaller Jishu shrine with two stones strategically placed at either end. Third, if you plan according to the temple schedule, you may have the opportunity to admire a variety of events that take place here, including Sumo wrestling, classical music concerts, Kabuki, Kyogen, and Noh.

After the heartwarming and touching visit to Kiyomizu-dera, it was time to head to our main focus of the trip, Fushimi Inari Taisha. This picturesque temple made me feel the sacred energy and its appeal—bright colors and thousands of magical torii gates that create a network of seemingly unending trails into the woods from the main building, making Inari-Taisha one of the most popular shrines in Japan. Following the trail for

about 30-45 minutes, I reached the Yotsutsuji intersection. This is about halfway up the mountain. There is a rest point from which one can enjoy some decent views over Kyoto. Many visitors only venture as far as this point. However, as a dedicated travel blogger who does the most for her readers, I continued my journey into the infernal realms. Eventually, the trail settled into a circular route up the mountain and around the summit of Mount Inari. Late afternoon is a great time to return from a hike, as the sunset views are beautiful, but take care to allow plenty of time to descend before night falls. There are also no more restaurants for tired travelers beyond the intersection, but some vending machines can be found along the way. Come prepared—as you climb, the prices of the machines increase! After my visit, there are a few reminders—The first thing a new visitor should know is that even if you are not going far onto the Fushimi Inari grounds, you are still going up. Prepare to climb many stairs and walk up an incline. Second, remember to bring a lightweight backpack and only pack minimal necessities; do not be like me because you will definitely feel like being pulled down into the stoned grounds by a mere backpack!

Looking back at the day, I can still feel the life and beauty soaked in me. Whether you are a family planning the next vacation, or simply a retired traveler seeking relaxation and pleasure, Kyoto is undoubtedly a 10/10 choice.

China's Space Exploration

Space exploration is relatively new for us, considering it was something we managed to do only since the second half of last century. With the first monkey sent to space in 1949, the first dog making an orbital space flight around earth, and finally with Neil Armstrong landing on the moon in 1969, the space programs have turned the Soviet Union and the US into technologically advanced nations. In fact, on NASA webpage under "Why go to space?", it states that "through space exploration, we gain a new perspective to study earth and the solar system." It also explains that "We advance new technologies that improve our daily lives, and we inspire a new generation of artists, thinkers, tinkerers, engineers, and scientists." Even though China joined the space race a few decades later, we still managed to launch our first space satellite in 1970 and we reached our first milestone in 2003 when Yana Liwei became the first Chinese to perform a spaceflight in orbit. This event marked the crucial moment of China, becoming only the third country, after Russia and the US, to launch its own crewed spacecraft. In other words, it crucially puts us on the map with the other two great nations.

Beyond fame and glory, the scientific breakthrough from past space programs should not be overlooked. For example, we take for granted that Nike Air Trainers, foil blankets for extreme temperature, portable water purification systems, car thermometers, freeze dried foods, and wireless technology for headsets, were all made possible because of their use in space. I can imagine that these will be part of the "space industry", which Xi Jinping highlighted in

his white paper "China's Space Program: a 2021 Perspective". The president even indicated how important it is when he called it "a critical element of the overall national strategy". I find it interesting that the advances from the ShenZhou programs were in the typical medical and environmental fields, such as stem cell research, regenerative medicine, reusable lift rockets, and extracting water from moon ice. However, there are recently most strategic international developments too: as a part of China's Belt and Road Initiative, CSNA is building the Fengyun space infrastructure to ensure that the BRI beneficiaries on the BRICS countries will be protected if the satellites in space ever fail, especially during conflicts. I see this as one of the many ways that China is securing international relationships. There are also commercial benefits. Through the Chang'e program, the white paper mentions space economy and tourism that will create new exciting markets in China and other nations.

When I think back at the moon landing, which was only 55 years ago, I am overcome by a great sense of admiration for the men and women that have contributed to get us this far. Speaking about the genders, living in a world of diversity, it is very tempting to think that women have been excluded from the space missions for decades until the first American female astronaut, Sally Ride, flew on the Challenger space shuttle in 1983. Nothing is further from the truth. In fact, many women from all races and all walks of life have worked hard in crucial fields of space exploration since the very beginning. Hidden Figures, a film which is based on a book by the same name, sheds light on the inspirational contributions coloured women like Mary Jackson, Catherine Johnson and Mary Hamilton have made. So the question definitely is not so much about how women can contribute to space exploration: they have been part of it since day one! Instead, the more interesting question should be whether the scientists have adequately studied space travel, especially when it comes to long missions, and the physical and mental effects it has on both men and women. In my view, it is in this kind of research that women will continue to play a role in space exploration.

Perhaps my interest in the above comes from my intrigue in stories and puzzles. As someone who isn't science-minded, I cannot promise to study hard in Physics, Chemistry or Maths in order to be able to contribute to solving new challenges of future space exploration. Nevertheless, I do feel a strong sense of pride being Chinese because according to Wikipedia, so far, China is one of only three countries that have built their own rockets and sent their own crew up to the stars. Because I love telling stories, I'm going to learn more about what CSNA does, its missions and goals. I will also explore how China's space advances fit into the greater picture of the geo-political scene. I love how there are so many puzzle pieces that come together on an international level. We are, after all, now a player among the big nations in this world theatre, I think that gaining a deeper understanding will help me explain to my friends and acquaintances how national space explanation contributes to our pride.

The Starting Point

Born into a middle-class family, Amber Lee was surrounded by encouragement and kindness. Her dream to be a jazz dancer was fully embraced by her parents, which led to her taking nonstop dancing lessons since the age of 6. In order to make her dream come true, Amber initially focused on honing her dancing technique and performance on stage by joining numerous large-scale dancing sessions and international competitions. These experiences and fame established a solid foundation for Amber. Consequently, she was able to study at Oxford Art University, one of the world's top ten art schools.

Knowledge is Power

Convincingly, Amber worked hard to pursue her dream. In 2012, she graduated from university with a bachelor's degree in Jazz Dance. Her performance at university was undoubtedly extraordinary, but she didn't stop there. At a young age, Amber believed it was worthwhile to acquire knowledge in other related fields of art. Therefore, she continued her studies at the World Academy of Drama, where she graduated three years later with a bachelor's degree in Performing Arts.

After graduation, Amber focused on choreography and was successfully recognized by the International Jazz Dance Association as a member of its jazz dance troupe, which is the highest-ranking dance group in the world. This recognition was the highest achievement

most dancers could ever imagine. In 2017, Amber won the championship in the AQ International Tournament, making her the most qualified female dancer at that time. Finally, she achieved her ideal self and stood on top of the world. Little did anyone know the challenges Amber would soon face.

The Sudden Injury that Changed the Game

In October 2017, Amber was invited to design a jazz dance performance for the opening ceremony of the 67th Basketball Exchange Competition in New York. Amber was highly concerned about this performance, as it was her first time designing such a largescale and important dance performance, which could also raise jazz dance to a high level of popularity and influence. After receiving the invitation, she spent most of her time designing and practicing the show. However, her concentration on the show abruptly came to a halt when an accident happened.

Three days before the competition, Amber fell from the stage while practicing with her team. This accident resulted in a broken left ankle, a twisted left elbow, and a serious wrist injury, which could potentially hinder her career as a professional jazz dancer. "I don't know why God played such a cruel joke on me... I truly love jazz dance, but it seems like I can never reach the level I should have. It almost crushed my spirit... my faith in my soul has withered," said Amber in an interview in December.

Despite her worrying injury, Amber's passion for jazz dance and her responsibility for the performances didn't allow her to cancel her involvement. Instead, she ingeniously designed a series of dance moves that she could perform while in a wheelchair, all while receiving emergency medical treatment for two days. Taking on the risk of further injury, Amber successfully performed on the day of the competition. Her performance caught the attention of many netizens and experienced artists. However, Amber wasn't able to fully capitalize on her newfound exposure because she was required to undergo four months of medical care and physical therapy. The serious injury had caused irreversible harm to Amber, which was undoubtedly a major setback for a young woman like her aspiring to be a better dancer.

The Depression

After receiving proper treatment, Amber's physical condition improved, and she started engaging in exercises again. However, the aftermath of her injury became an inevitable obstacle in her career, forcing this strong woman to give up her dream just when she was on the brink of success. In January 2018, Amber was diagnosed with depression upon realizing that she might not be able to dance anymore. All the time and money she had invested in dancing seemed to have turned to dust in the air. Amber felt as though she had lost her worth in the world. During this period, she found herself crying every day and

avoiding social interactions. In a state of despair, she even made five suicide attempts before leaving the hospital.

At the insistence of her parents, Amber did not enter a psychiatric hospital. Instead, she stayed in her own apartment, surrounded by her family and close friends for two months. Their unwavering support and encouragement played a vital role in helping Amber accept her new reality and adopt a different perspective. "Indeed, depression nearly destroyed me. Without the support of my family and my dear friends who always had my back, I would never have been able to overcome my depression," Amber

"I remember one day, my mother came and encouraged me. She said that nothing could ever deny my passion for jazz dance, not even my own body. That's when I realized that if I wanted to continue pursuing my dream, I had to stand up and give it my all, regardless of the consequences, because I was born to dance." Although Amber had lost the ability to perform complex dance moves, she fully utilized her understanding of jazz dance and performing arts, leading to the emergence of a brilliant jazz choreographer. She became known for her intricate dance moves and romantic style in her works.

In 2021, Amber was invited to design the opening performance of the XXIV Olympic Winter Games held in Beijing in 2022. It was her first international event as a choreographer. Similar to her journey to fame as a jazz dancer, the only difference was that she was now more mature and composed. Returning to the world stage, she was no longer the girl dancing beautifully on stage, but her determination for jazz dance remained unchanged.

Furthermore, after experiencing those heart-wrenching moments, Amber was determined to extend a helping hand to those struggling with serious injuries or mental illnesses that prevented them from chasing their dreams. From 2018 to 2023, Amber donated over three billion USD to charities like the World Mental Health Organization and the Dream Chaser Association, providing financial support for medical expenses of injured individuals. Additionally, she volunteered as a teacher for several teenage jazz teams, recognizing education as an effective way to develop the jazz dance industry. "Every time I see those kids dancing in the classroom, I feel that despite my physical condition, I can still pass on something about dance to future generations... these kids have filled the void in my heart," Amber responded during a TV programme when asked about why she continues her volunteer work in education despite her busy schedule.

In November 2022, Amber founded a funding agency called Phoenix, which provides financial aid for young jazz dancers and offers jazz dance lessons to discover and support talented individuals who may not have the means to afford expensive

professional dance lessons. On the agency's website, it is written, "I was once defeated by hopelessness and reborn in the fire of hell. If I could overcome pain and suffering, so can you. Believe that we are all phoenixes deserving of a second chance to live a better life! Phoenixes, it's time for you to bloom! —Amber Lee, Founder of Phoenix."

The Admirable One

There are always skeptics who question the significance of dreams. To them, pursuing dreams may seem foolish and pointless. However, throughout human history, it has been dreams that have motivated game-changing events. Dreams are what Leonardo da Vinci persistently pursued in his life. JASMINE:

What a disgrace!

(BANG.)

How could mother treat me like that? It's been a week since I've been forced to marry this random old guy. I must record this tragedy as a last effort. I must let people know about this, and empower those who share my fate. (BEEP.) Hi, if you are listening, please, I need you.

Girls like me need you. I am Jasmine, thirteen, an Indian raised in the United States. I, like many others, am a victim of forced marriage. My struggles have recently come to an endnot because I've escaped, but because there IS NO ESCAPE. This is my last call for help, but it might as well serve as my "dying message". For quite some time, my mom has been setting me up with random men, much older than me, to get married. She says that it is the only way I can contribute to my family. I just talked to her, to try and beg her to take me home, but these were her exact words. "You either stay with him, or from this day onward you are dead in our eyes. You have shamed and dishonoured our family." What am I supposed to do? I'm at this crossroads that leads to two dead ends. (peeking outside of the door) Okay, she's not listening. I either wake up beside this stranger, my so called husband, knowing that he could molest me at any given moment or never see my socalled family ever again, and am made to believe that it's my fault. No matter which path I chose, I'm done for. How do you expect a thirteen-year-old to deal with this madness? It's my own life that's at stake! For so long I've carried this as shame and guilt,

but with nothing else to lose, why not make something out of this meaningless life? WHY NOT MAKE A DECISION ABOUT MY OWN LIFE FOR ONCE?

The thing is, there's nothing I can do. I live in Brooklyn, and people don't believe me because they think that this sort of human rights abuse doesn't happen in America. I live in an ultra-Orthodox Jewish community, where I was raised basically from infancy, to become a wife and a mother. I studied at a school where I received limited education from cooking to sewing. (throwing needles and cloth) I was even forced to sign a paper in which I promised to never take a college entrance exam and a driver's test. I was never given a choice when to date or marry. I have nothing to lose right now. Last night, my husband punched the wall in a blind rage (pointing to crack on wall) because I refused to go to bed with him. A while later, he even threatened to kill me. That's why I went to my mom for help. In my religious community, I have no reproductive rights, no financial rights, and very limited legal rights. I am not allowed to divorce my husband under religious law, only he could divorce me. The only way out is for my family to agree to take me back in. Yet, my mom doesn't care. She's using honour violence to threaten me, to cut all my connections and disown me. I'm a child. What else can I do but to oblige?

(Someone is outside.) I'll be quick! Mom... (glancing at the door) My other source of hope would be to turn to domestic violence shelters. However, that chance is ever so a glimpse. Let's dig deeper. Marriage before 18 is legal in all 50 US states, and in 28

states, there's no minimum age for marriage. Child marriages are basically forced marriages because before turning eighteen, we are powerless to say no. If I left one day, I would be considered a runaway. The police would search for me everywhere, drag me back home, then charge me with an offence for leaving. If any organisation helped with my escape, they'd be charged criminally. No shelter I went to wanted to take me in before I turned eighteen. THAT'S PRECISELY WHY I WENT TO YOU **BECAUSE I AM NOT 18 YET!**

Now that I am trapped in this abusive marriage, can I file for divorce? I must, right? It's a basic human right! Well, I was wrong. Once again, I must be over 18 to file for divorce unless my parents file one for me. (ripping a pile of paper on the desk) Well, they were the ones who got me into this mess, so why would they let me escape? It seems like my only escape is death. But I refuse. I refuse to go down like many fellow victims, and let this horror go on and on. Girls in my community disappear one by one, (banging the desk), or they are sent away to marry men they've only seen in photographs. Yet, NOBODY ever questions their absence. If I'd go down anyway, at least I'd go down making a lasting impact. That's why I'm here right now, recording my experience. Maybe this video would be like Anne Frank's diary one day! Who knows?

(checking again) I must go soon. Before I stop recording, here're some more final thoughts. Don't ignore this call for help. Child marriage and forced marriage in general is much more devastating than one could ever imagine. Firstly, it's a complete violation of

human rights including our right to life, liberty, education and security. We are not allowed to make decisions about our own lives. Secondly, it is deeply rooted in gender inequality, where women are disproportionately affected. It reinforces gender stereotypes where men hold power and superiority over women. Ironically, it is also the women who mainly uphold this honour system, like my mom is doing right now. Thirdly, we suffer from unimaginable health risks. Waking up each day, I cower before my husband knowing he could physically, sexually and emotionally abuse me. Some days I don't even know if I'll wake up anymore.

I've seen girls my age get pregnant with their undeveloped bodies as soon as they got married. Lastly, we are easily denied education at a young age, limiting our opportunities for personal development, economic independence and social mobility. It leads to a vicious cycle of poverty as we get financially dependent on our spouses and unable to pursue education or employment.

Child marriage is so difficult to deal with because of its deep entrenchment in social and cultural norms, like in my Jewish community. AI: Friend or Foe?

Good morning, ladies and gentlemen.

'I can do anything '—an encouragement that one would always give to oneself to overcome your limits. Well, the same goes for 'A.I.' — artificial intelligence, which has matured and become unimaginably potent over the years—it really can do anything. In light of this, the capacity of humans seems insignificant. We can't learn as fast as Al can, memorize as much as Al can, and work as efficiently as Al can. Under the pressure of Al surpassing humans in numerous aspects, there has been a controversy about whether Al is our friend or foe.

For me, the role of AI is more of a friend than an enemy.

Skeptics are saying that Al is replacing humans at work. For instance, Al is on the verge of transforming the fishery and agriculture industries. Aquatic animals and crops are experiencing higher breeding rates and harvests thanks to Al. Al is said to have the definite potential to replace farmers. Recently, 31-year-old Ph.D. graduate Hao Xiaotian from the HKUST has developed an Al system that can analyze images to capture the moment when soft-shelled crabs are at their most plump and immediately fish them out with a robotic

arm. Compared with traditional breeding methods, the survival rate of crabs has increased from 5% to 95%. If more similar Al systems are developed, shortly, farmers will soon be replaced by robotic arms. Not only the primary industry but also even higherskilled jobs, such as managers and administrators, may also be replaced. Soon, Al can analyze a company's data and generate a management proposal within a few minutes. Similarly, administrative paperwork would be done in the blink of an eye. Humans are confronting the risk of massive unemployment.

Nevertheless, we shouldn't neglect the fact that new jobs

may emerge along with the advancement of Al. New jobs such as Al prompt engineers, Al trainers and operators, Al ethicists, etc., are in demand because we need some to act as facilitators between humans and technology. People can be employed in these new roles with the right knowledge and skills. How about the lowskilled groups, like farmers? The government has the social responsibility to open doors for these social groups to acquire skills, both in different professions and in Al utilization. Thus, they can at least be qualified to switch their jobs from farmers to other professions, possibly Al-related. Even though Al is continuously advancing, the unemployment rate wouldn't skyrocket as long as new job opportunities are available.

Moreover, critics are concerned that the beyond-thinkable abilities of AI will be manipulated by the malicious, creating unforeseeable consequences. Criminals can now use Al for 'brute forcing' to access passwords through different combinations of characters and numbers. If your accounts are targeted, Al can be used to analyze your cyber footprints, thus narrowing the possibilities of your password combinations. By analyzing your frequently posted content on social media, such as your birthday, your age, etc... In no time, criminals may easily guess your passwords and gain access to your accounts. You may suddenly lose your wealth if your bank account credentials are stolen. Another way Al is used in crime is deep fakes. Al can be digitally manipulated to copy and paste a renowned figure onto a nobody. Such transformation may trick the public into believing that the statements made by the nobody are legitimate, thus speaking ill of the figure's personality if the statements are untrue or offensive. However, despite the use of Al in crime, AI, in return, can restrict cybercriminal activities. Haven't you had the experience of being provided with automatically generated passwords? These complicated characters given by Al enhance the security of your passwords, making them better than the passwords manually generated. To solve issues like faking faces and voices, Al is also there to help. Intel has developed 'FakeCatcher,' a system that can differentiate between deep-fake videos and videos with real humans by detecting blood flow and eye movements. Although the technology is yet to be improved, it shows that Al can be used to fight against the improper use of technology. Al systems can dissolve criminal activities, thus preventing unwanted damage brought by Al crime.

The fear of Al being too powerful to control and becoming a tool for ill-natured acts is being stirred up, and some are doubtful of Al's role in human society as it gradually intrudes into manifold aspects of our lives. Still, we shouldn't be blinded by these concerns and should stay openminded to see how good a friend Al is to us.

Al is undoubtedly a partner who can boost our productivity and assist us in achieving exceptional results that we can't produce with human effort alone. It's often said that the emergence of Al erodes the development of art because AI can now generate artwork with its mass database. However, this is different from the holistic view. This year's hottest J-pop music duo, YOASOBI, has revealed their essentials in producing their catchy and fastpaced songs: Logic Pro, which is a composition arrangement

software, and Vocaloid, which is an Al-based voice synthesizer. The singer of the group, Ikura, uses the vocal synthesizer Hatsune Miku to understand the melody and rhythm of their songs, and thus they can make further arrangements. Without Al, we wouldn't be able to enjoy the peculiar yet artistic tunes from YOASOBI. This perfectly demonstrates how Al as a creative friend can collaborate with humans to deliver something extraordinary. We have witnessed how the collaboration of Al and humans benefits efficiency and effectiveness in multiple ways: robots aiding surgeons to perform microsurgical procedures, Al creating furniture models with accurate measurements and suggesting designs for designers, and auto-generated presentations to speed up ideaselling. These examples have exemplified how the joint effort of humans and Al can boost work performance and create favorable outcomes speedily.

On top of being a productivity booster, Al may be the key to solving current world issues. Al can use the vast database to synthesize information and detect what existing systems are lacking. Loopholes can be identified and/or provided for related professionals as a reference. The United Nations Environment Program has once lauded AI as a tool that could improve our understanding of our environmental impact and the effects of climate change. Using satellite images, Al can analyze the changes in the environments prone to climate change, for instance, the Arctic zone and the Amazon forest, and allow professionals to discover the crux that is deteriorating the problem, thus switching their direction in formulating mitigation strategies. Al may even generate these strategies

for us. In a few decades, AI can be seen to be restoring the ozone layer or building a facility that can reflect solar radiation, lowering the temperature of the surface of the earth. Aside from saving our environment, there's a ray of hope in solving societal challenges. A common societal issue is that those in need often wait too long for the applications of social services, such as public housing or government childcare services. Without prioritizing the needs of the cases, those in most urgent need may not benefit from welfare. However,

Al's strong analytical skills and database can analyze cases and prioritize which applications should be handled first. This not only quickens the application procedures and increases the possibilities of successful approvals, but also ensures that those in greatest need can access welfare services first, thus alleviating serious societal issues like inadequate housing and child neglect. Al has proved to be a valuable friend to tackle problems that require solutions beyond human capacity.

As powerful as AI is, it can do anything that can expand our productivity and tackle urgent matters. Admittedly, AI poses risks such as unemployment and misuse. But there are solutions to these risks, and we needn't worry about AI's turning our lives into a dystopia. Treat AI as our friend rather than enemy and fully utilize their powers, then we can do everything beyond our imagination.

Being from a Chinese family, I was burdened with immense pressure in academics, and just to excel in everything in general, ever since I was young. The only getaway from this toxic environment was my pet, a grey hamster called Lupa. The playfulness and innocence she naturally possessed reminds me of the more subtle simplicities in life, and from her, I learned to build friendship, love, and trust, something I did not receive from my parents. As she aged, however, I learned another lesson about life -on death and its implications a forever goodbye.

The day this arrived was when we brought her to the vet, and the vet announced that the malignant tumor was causing her too much pain. I made the difficult decision that I knew was coming. As I held her in my hands, the shivering subsiding as the chemical reached her bloodstream, the heat and warmth slowly escaping from her body, I realized that some goodbyes are more of a relief than a mortification—a relief from her pain, from mine, as I watched her struggle against the deadly disease day by day.

In high school, I chose to study Biology in honor of Lupa. I was horrified when one day, Ms. Young came in with a box of rats for us to dissect. Without hesitation, my classmates cut open their skin, reveling at the intricate circulatory web and organs inside, but all I could see was Lupa's body, lying in that same immobile position ominously resembling crucifixion her arms and legs splayed out and held in place with a pinhead. I watched in silence until I could not take it anymore. I ran to Ms. Young demanding justice, "How can you stand watching these students who don't even have a care for animals cut them open as if they were pieces of garbage? How can you stand killing these creatures year by year, for our supposed education but our vanity to

reassure ourselves that we are superior to animals?" The next few seconds were chilling, before Ms. Young replied, to my surprise, "I do not want this either."

Ever since then, my respect for Ms. Young deepened, and she, noticing my love for animals, assumed the role of a mentor to me as I trudged through the treacherous waters of the education system, and joined the countless programmes and projects that served as a relief to the academic rigor. While working on a research project studying the occurrence of cancer in mammals, I asked her about that day. She replied, with a heavy tone, that it was what her job required her to do; but she understood me completely, as she went through the same battle herself every time. "But for you to put it out in words for me it awakened something that had been deeply buried before," she said. Then, with a glance at the research paper I was piecing together, she said, "You made me realize we can't do things for others. That all along I have been a puppet for going against what my heart tells me is right or wrong."

That year, Ms. Young left the school. In private, she told me she was going overseas for conservation fieldwork, and as happy as I was for her, I despaired at the loss of a close friend and mentor. As a farewell gift, she left me a bookmark saying, "Do what your heart tells you is right or wrong".

Five years later, as I graduated from university with a first-class honors diploma in biomedical science, I was offered a job at a world-renowned institution specializing in cancer treatment research. I saw this as a good way to honor Lupa, who had died of this disease, and Ms. Young, who poured great effort into nurturing my passion for science. It did not

occur to me that once again the scene in high school would play out. When I discovered the institution used rats to experiment with possible treatments, and to do that, they first exposed rats to radioactive substances to induce cancer. Following orders in silence, I prepared the X-radiation machine, and cupped a rat in my hands. She struggled and shivered, as if sensing her doomed fate, and I was reminded of Lupa again, who shivered in my hands in her final moments before our goodbye, of the glassy eyes of the rat on our dissection board in high school, and of Ms. Young, who had left me with that note. And I realized I could not do it, and would never agree to do it. "You are saving countless lives if you manage to find a treatment," the researcher overseeing me said. "It is a sacrifice, a worthy sacrifice for mankind." But one life for another—who is to say what is worthy, and what is not?

I quit my job despite the reputation and high wage, and went to graduate school to study to become a veterinarian. Throughout this journey, I have had heartbreaking partings, with Lupa, with Ms. Young, with my dream job. Yet, unlike the first two, the last one was a choice I made with deliberation and gusto, as I came to the realization that some things are not worth going against my heart for. The two farewells, however, saddening and painful, were not in vain. They were what built me, allowing me to grow into the person I am today, who is proud of following her own moral compass, who saved, if only one, rat's life by doing what she thinks is right. Saying goodbye is never easy—there will forever be a Lupashaped hole in my heart, and I will miss Ms. Young from across the ocean—but sometimes goodbyes are necessary, for us to grow, for us to learn what is important to us.

In accordance with the school's major concern of this year, "Try all-IN SET to Shine", a workshop entitled "Cultivating Positive Emotions" was held on 29th August 2023. The workshop let teachers learn how to cultivate positive emotions. Through the "laughter yoga" activities, various games and group sharing, teachers were able to better understand common positive emotions, choose to look at things from an optimistic perspective, and learn how to enhance positive emotions or relieve negative emotions. Teachers spent an enjoyable afternoon in a relaxed mood. They were highly engaged in the activities, and could also put aside the pressure of starting school temporarily.

Besides, on the afternoon of 31st October, our school invited The Asian Academy of Family Therapy to conduct a seminar on the topic of "The family has got sick" for us. Through two real cases, the speakers and teachers investigated together how family interactions affect children's mood and behavior, and looked into how the two families in the course of treatment had found a way out. We also thought about together, from a different perspective, the kind of student support to be given by the school.

All the teachers of our school will attend the "Wan Chai District Joint Secondary School Teachers' Development Day" on 29th November 2023. In the first part, the main speaker is Dr. Lam Hiu Fung,



who will speak about "學術誠信與人工智能:如何防止學生濫用人工智能學習?". In the second part, the main speaker is Ms. Sze Sau Ching, who will speak on the topic of "明辨新聞資訊真偽".

In order to prepare for the major concerns of 2024–2027, based on the questionnaire results of teachers, parents and students, an analysis of students' learning, the current situation and needs of students' moral character, affection, etc. was made by all teachers on 2nd–3rd January 2024. Then on 8th April, based on the qualitative feedback of student focus interviews, the major concerns for the next school year were finalized

by all teachers, with feasible goals and strategies initially planned. Through heated discussions and professional exchanges among teachers, a consensus was reached.

On 11th June, we invited Dr. Lee Yik Ling, an alumna of our school, to give our teachers a talk entitled "How to improve body immunity from the perspective of Chinese medicine". We also invited the instructors of the Hong Kong Stretching Exercise Association to give teachers guidance on daily exercise skills at our school, to raise their awareness of health and related knowledge.



今天,我想以真光街坊的身份來 跟大家進行分享。為什麼呢?因 為我在這附近生活了五十年,所 以每一天,我差不多都會見到各 位真光的同學,會看見穿着藍色 長衫的同學。五十年前,真光裏 穿藍色長衫的不只是同學,老師 及校長也是穿着藍色長衫的,所 以我們很難分辨出哪一位是同 學,哪一位是老師。以前,我也 有很多機會進入真光的校園,但 今天不一樣,我很高興能在這裏 參加大家的畢業禮。我相信大家 都記掛着下星期二的派位結果。 各位同學,其實你們比我厲害, 因為我連小學都沒有畢業。可能 你會感到奇怪,為何我會連小學 都沒有畢業呢?因為很久前,我 是讀英文學校的,而我們是由第 九級開始讀到第一級,所以是沒 有小學畢業的, 甚至連小學的畢 業證書也沒有。但現在不同了, 同學們,今天們的畢業禮,而你 們下星期亦將要面對派位的結 果。

各位家長,你們將子女帶來真光 學校讀書,這是一個最明智的決 定。那麼多學校你們不選而選擇 真光,我相信你們一定是發現了 真光擁有一些其他學校沒有的特 色,所以願意付出金錢,讓你們 的子女在真光完成六年的學業。 下星期二要派位了,我相信家長 們都很擔心,但我想跟各位家長 説,其實這是一個很好的機會、 時間,讓你們和子女一起去面對 他們人生中的一個考驗,陪伴他 們一起去面對未知的將來。各位 同學,我相信在真光六年的學習 裏,真光學校已經教導了你們如 何成為一個有真光精神的人,怎 樣才能成為一個標準的真光兒 女。我相信作為一個真光的畢業 生,你們一定會把標準真光兒女 的十條誡命記在心中。各位同學, 無論你們將來到哪一間學校讀 書,你們都要記住曾經在真光得 到老師們的教導,將真光的精神 傳揚開去。

今天,我最後想跟大家分享一首歌,希望同學們能夠記住它。這

首歌以前叫《生活歌》,1949年,何中中校長將它再編成今天的《放光芒》。這首歌裏提到,我們無論在任何地方,在每一天的生活中,都要為主發光。上帝使我們每一個人,好像一盞明燈

一樣在世上照耀,使我們在這個 世界之中成為一盞燈台去照耀迷 失的人。我希望同學們能一直為 主發光,在每一日,每時每刻, 都要為主發光。
